## PM 608 Pastoral Care and Counseling

Monday Evenings, Beginning January 6, 6-9 PM

This course is an introduction to pastoral care and counseling with a focus on the problems usually experienced by church leaders in the local congregation (death, aging, grief, sickness, family tensions, etc.). A variety of theories and methods is examined. Goals of the course include personal growth and the development of counseling skills.

Dr. Parks has served as pastor of the Mt. Sinai Missionary Baptist church since 1991. His extensive experience as a pastor and counselor enrich his teaching. He is a minister in the Progressive National Baptist Convention. ### ET 750 Medical Ethics

Tuesday Evenings, Beginning January 7, 6-9 PM

This course gives an introduction to approaches to medical ethics, reviews the history of medical ethics, and examines the contemporary medical ethical issues from pre-birth to the end of life, the financial issues of bioethics, and systems of delivering medical care. Emphasis is on the personhood of the patient in terms of the image of God and

the derived sacredness of human life. This course places particular focus on current issues such as the Human Genome Project, reproductive issues, and physician-assisted killing. This is a DLI Certification Course.

#### HT 560 Reformed Spirituality Thursday Evenings, Beginning January 9, 6-9 PM

This course examines the Biblical foundations, history, and theology of Reformed spirituality (also called the doctrine of the Christian life, or sanctification). Students read spiritual classics such as Calvin's Golden Booklet of the Christian Life, Richard Baxter's Reformed Pastor, the Heidelberg Catechism, and others. Students also consider contributions from other Christian traditions such as

the holiness movement and the charismatic renewal, as well as from the history of Christian thinking about the contemplative life. This is a DLI Certification Course.

Dr. Johnson is a popular preacher and inspiring classroom teacher. He particularly enjoys taking students and other groups to study Reformation church history in Germany, Prague, and the British Isles. He serves as an elder in the Presbyterian Church in America. ## OT 502 Old Testament II Saturdays, January 11, February 8, March 14, April 18

This course traces the history and examines the literature of the Israelite people from the division of the kingdom through the development of Judaism. In this course, the Hebrew poetic and wisdom literature of the Old Testament is studied along with such other topics as the content, interpretation, and the unity of

the Old Testament.

Dr. Eves is a careful scholar and teacher who brings over 30 years of experience in the church and classroom. He is known for mentoring students both in and out of the classroom.
