CH 501 Early and Medieval Church History

Tuesday Evenings: 6:00pm - 9:00pm, Beginning August 24

This survey course traces the development of the Christian church from the end of the apostolic period to the division between East and West and of the western church up to the 15th century Renaissance. Students examine the changing relation between church and empire, the development of Christian doctrine, the rise of the papacy, and the variety of patterns of Christian spirituality.

Dr. Johnson is a popular preacher and inspiring classroom teacher. He particularly enjoys taking students and other groups to study Reformation church history in Germany. He serves as an elder in the Presbyterian Church in America.



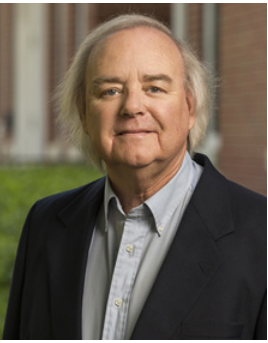

HB 501 Biblical Hebrew I

Monday Evenings: 6:00pm - 9:00pm, Beginning August 23 (Open to College Students)

A study of the fundamentals of classical Hebrew grammar, syntax, and vocabulary, this course prepares the student for Old Testament interpretation.

A recipient of Aberdeen University's Elphinstone PhD Scholarship, Dr. Marr's 2019 dissertation examined how second-generation Associate/Seceder theology was outworked in Scotland, Ireland, and the American Colonies. His six years serving as a Hebrew tutor and his doctoral work that addressed exclusive psalmody in the eighteenth century provide the basis for his student-centered and ministry-applicational approach.

GK 501 Biblical Greek I

Monday Evenings: 6:00pm - 9:00pm, Beginning August 23 (Open to College Students)

This course introduces the fundamentals of New Testament (Koine) Greek grammar. Emphasis is placed on the mastery of vocabulary, morphology, and syntax.

Dr. Melton's broad experience in the church, gracious manner, and excellent teaching have made him a favorite of many students. As the Director of Erskine's Doctor of Ministry program, he has guided countless students through ministry projects that have sharpened their skills and strengthened the church.
